Sneaker Recycling

The Outreach team is joining a Davidson Town project that will ensure that sneakers don't wind up in area landfills. As important as it is to keep the sneakers out of landfills, the other big news is that 100% of proceeds from this effort will be donated to the Davidson Veterans Monument fund, currently being planned for Downtown Davidson.

So, dig through those closets. Do your spring cleaning now! Bring your sneakers to the church and put in the collection container during the month of May.

Things to Ponder

Most people throw away their used sneakers every 125-200 days without ever thinking about recycling. Since sneakers are manufactured with materials that are not biodegradable, they remain in landfills or are incinerated, which leads to toxic chemicals in our air and soil.

The process of manufacturing sneakers produces large amounts of CO2 which contributes to the serious effects of climate change and global warming. Recycling and reusing sneakers keeps sneakers out of landfills, reduces the need for manufacturing new shoes and sneakers, and supports a growing circular economy.

A quick final note – this is only for sneakers, not non-athletic shoes.

<u>HUGS</u> is a unique camp for unique people, bringing together young people of diverse abilities. They overcome barriers of real and



imagined differences and build bridges of understanding. HUGS is about acknowledging the good creation in each of us and more fully knowing and loving our God through it. The great differences among campers and staff help all of us learn to appreciate and celebrate our diversity as we recognize our common ground.

STILL NEEDED:

Buddy campers are rising 9th-12th graders who help campers with special needs enjoy all aspects of a typical summer camp experience. Buddy campers arrive on Saturday, July 6, to be trained to work with campers with special needs, who arrive on Monday, July 8.

Staff must have completed their first year of college and are expected to stay in cabins with campers, as well as serve on one of the following teams: camp life, worship, activities or program. Before camp, there is a mandatory Zoom meeting with the entire staff, as well as individual meetings with the team you have been assigned. Staff earn a stipend for their work.

Upcoming Racial Equity Training Opportunities

The **Racial Equity Institute (REI)**'s foundational Racial Equity Training workshop provides an analysis of race and racism from a systems perspective. That is, it addresses racism not only from the standpoint of individual bias but



also by examining the historical roots of racism as it affects institutions—the church, education, health care, criminal justice, etc.—and what effect that has on the opportunities that white people and people of color have. Although this is a secular training, people of faith from multiple denominations are well-represented. To help defray the cost of the training, the diocese, through the Racial Justice and Reconciliation Committee (RJRC) offers funding.
